School Waste Reduction – NERC is an Expert

Schools generate a lot of waste—from paper and books to computers and food. Most schools are interested in becoming more proactive in waste reduction, recycling, and composting, but are often unable to move forward because of inexperience, lack of support, and concerns over cost. By acting, schools can decrease disposal and purchasing costs and potentially generate revenues through the sale of recyclables. Schools can also benefit from the environmental education and service-learning opportunities presented through better management of school wastes.

There can be a dramatic impact by providing schools with the resources and technical assistance to create or expand reuse, recycling, and composting programs. The average student produces a $\frac{1}{2}$ - 1 pound of trash during the typical school day. With the implementation of "materials management" school facilities can decrease this by up to 80%. Cafeteria waste reduction and organics diversion programs are an area where many schools struggle. A comprehensive assessment of Minnesota schools found that 50% of school waste could be managed through composting programs that accept food waste, liquids, and non-recyclable paper.
