What is it?

At free monthly Fix-It Clinics, volunteers with repair skills help residents disassemble, troubleshoot and fix their household appliances and clothing.





Multiple benefits

- Participants learn new skills through diagnosis and repair
- Reduce waste and conserve resources
- Build community

What do we work on?

- Common household items
- Electronics
- Toys
- Clothing and linens









Checking in

 A description of your item is recorded, along with its weight and what's wrong with it.





Working together

 Then you get paired with volunteers who have mechanical, electrical or electronics skills. And you work on your item together.





Measurement

- We weigh the items to figure out how much stuff we divert from the trash.
- As you leave, we ask if your item got fixed and have you fill out a survey.





By the numbers

- 42 events so far
 one clinic is
 held each month
- Pounds diverted from the waste stream: 18,084
- Average fix rate:77 percent
- Volunteer hours to date: 4,724

Choose to Reuse




- Through the Choose to Reuse coupon book, app and online directory, reuse retailers can showcase their goods as an option to buying new.
- Choose to Reuse program started in 2002. In 2015, 56 businesses at 86 locations participated.
- The reuse industry is made up of mostly independent retailers, franchisee retailers and non-profit organizations. Many in the industry don't have the resources to widely advertise their business.
