Sarah Reeves, RIRRC, was thanked for hosting two glass recycling facility tours this afternoon. Approximately 60 people participated in the tours.

Treasurer's Report (Attachment A): After discussion, Guy Watson moved to accept as presented. The motion was seconded by Robert Isner. The vote was unanimous in support of the motion.

Review of votes taken since previous Board meeting (Attachment B): Greg Cooper moved to approve as presented, and Sarah Reeves seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous in support of the motion.

Annual Report: After discussion, Greg Cooper moved to approve as presented along with FY 2015 Audit. Peter Pettit seconded. The vote was unanimous in support.

Report of Bylaw Committee: After discussion of the recommendations presented by the Bylaw Committee, Peter Pettit moved that Article II be amended as presented. The motion was seconded by Guy Watson. There were 7 votes in favor, and one abstention. The motion passed. The new language reads:

The purposes of the Corporation shall be to conduct research and educate the public about the environmental and economic benefits of recycling and source reduction in the Northeast as well as the United States. Recycling and source reduction includes reuse, re-manufacture, composting, and any other activity that decreases the amount and/or toxicity of material in the solid waste stream requiring disposal. The Corporation shall be operated exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Additional suggestions were made regarding bylaw revisions and it was agreed that the Committee will continue its work and come back with further suggestions to the Board. The goal is to have completed revisions of the bylaws by early 2016.

Development Committee Recommendations: The Committee Recommendations were considered and it was agreed that the Committee will continue with its work and deliberations.

Process for updating vision statement: It was agreed that Board members were asked to review the vision statement and send proposed revisions to Lynn. She will compile them and the Bylaw Committee will develop recommendations for consideration by the full Board.

The meeting was adjourned at 9 p.m.
